Basic Academy Curriculum

Beginning a Chaplaincy (FFC-05); starting a chaplaincy and working with other chaplains: hospital chaplains, law enforcement chaplains and fire chaplains.

Ceremonies, Events, and Funerals (FFC-09 & ICPC-B04); the chaplain's involvement in various public events and ceremonies.

Chaplain & First Responder Safety (FFC-06);

Confidentiality and Legal Liability (ICPC-B05); identify, define and address the legal and ethical responsibilities while serving as a chaplain and a confidant.

Critical Incident Stress Management (FFC-07 & ICPC-B03); recognize and deal with aspects of Critical Incident Stress Management (CISM), burnout, and post-traumatic stress.

Death Notifications (ICPC-B02); introduce strategic principles designed to prepare the chaplain to deliver a more effective death notification.

Death Notification Scenarios & Practice

Ethics (ICPC-B06); moral decisions faced by First Responders and chaplains alike.

Evening Briefing – Guest Speakers on Various Topics

First Responder Families (FFC-02 & ICPC-B08); describes the First Responder family and how chaplains can minister to them.
