OCA Basics is held at the <u>Department of Public Safety Standards</u> and <u>Training</u>, which is the home for training and licensing of First Responders. During the week, you will eat meals and sleep in dorms with new recruits going through their academy experience. It provides a rich environment for familiarizing yourself with First Responder culture.
